Introduction

Seventh—day Adventists have ever asked the question: *Is there more light to be revealed to the people of God for these last days?* We can be certain that more light was to come to the Adventist church after the death of Ellen G. White. Her writings have ever illuminated and guided the church step-by-step for many years but since her death in 1915 many were left wondering if God had more light to reveal to His people. This candid investigation into the writings of the *Spirit of Prophecy* will sufficiently answer the question if more light was to be revealed to the people of God for these last days.
